The Disability Rights Education and Defense Fund (DREDF) ADA Topic Guides DREDF recently released a series of Topic Guides on Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Transportation. Development of the Topic Guides was funded by the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) to provide technical assistance on ADA transportation issues to transportation providers, riders, and advocates. The Topic Guides bring together information about the requirements of the ADA and US Department of Transportation ADA regulations, FTA ADA enforcement determinations, and best operational practices for compliance from transit providers. The Topic Guides are useful tools for both large and small transit operators.

Topics include: Equipment Maintenance, Stop Announcement and Route Identification, Eligibility for ADA Paratransit, Telephone Hold Time in ADA Paratransit, Origin-to-Destination Service in ADA Paratransit, On-Time Performance in ADA Paratransit, and No-Shows in ADA Paratransit
