DHS Announces Grants to Secure Bus Travel

The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) will provide 55 grants totaling approximately \$9.9 million to improve security for operators and passengers by providing operator training and physical enhancements to bus company and industry association facilities and assets. The grants will provide for vehicle and facility security enhancements, as well as security equipment for over-the-road buses.

Grant funding will be used to augment the investments of system owners and operators in a number of areas including driver protection, tracking and communication systems, security assessments and/or development of security plans, and training for transportation personnel to recognize and respond to criminal attacks and terrorist threats. Grants also will pay for physical security enhancements such as fencing, lighting, and surveillance equipment at terminals and maintenance facilities.

FTA Emphasizes United We Ride

<u>United We Ride</u> -- a new five-part initiative-- to break down the barriers between programs and set the stage for local partnerships that generate common sense solutions and deliver A-plus performance for everyone who needs transportation.

The *United We Ride* initiative includes:

- A Framework for Action. Created by a panel of experts from around the country that convened in August 2003, this publication is a self-assessment tool that States and communities can use to identify areas of success and highlight the actions still needed to improve the coordination of human service transportation.
- <u>State Leadership Awards</u>. These initial awards have recognized a select number of States that have accomplished significant progress in human service transportation coordination.
- National Leadership Forum on Human Service Transportation Coordination. This conference, held in late February 2004, brought together Governor appointed senior leadership teams seeking to raise the visibility of the issue among State leaders and secure commitments to action. The forum was used to provide technical assistance, as well as to recognize those States that have already taken significant steps to improve human service transportation services.
- *State Coordination Grants.* States participating in the United We Ride National Leadership Forum will be eligible to submit an application for State Coordination Grants, to address gaps and needs related to human

service transportation in their geographic regions.

 Help Along the Way. This ongoing technical assistance program will build on the work of the Community Transportation Assistance Program (CTAP), the Rural Transportation Assistance Program (RTAP), Easter Seals Project ACTION and other stakeholders to provide handson assistance to States and communities in the development and delivery of coordinated human service transportation programs.
