FTA Announces United We Ride

<u>United We Ride</u> -- a new five-part initiative-- to break down the barriers between programs and set the stage for local partnerships that generate common sense solutions and deliver A-plus performance for everyone who needs transportation.

The *United We Ride* initiative will include:

• <u>A Framework for Action.</u> Created by a panel of experts from around the country that convened in August 2003, this publication is a self-assessment tool

that States and communities can use to identify areas of success and highlight the actions still needed to improve the coordination of human service transportation.

- **State Leadership Awards.** These awards will recognize a select number of States that have accomplished significant progress in human service transportation coordination. Award applications should be submitted no later than January 9, 2004.
- National Leadership Forum on Human Service Transportation
 Coordination. This conference, planned for late February 2004, will bring together Governor appointed senior leadership teams seeking to raise the visibility of the issue among State leaders and secure commitments to action. The forum will be used to provide technical assistance, as well as to recognize those States that have already taken significant steps to improve human service transportation services.
- *State Coordination Grants*. States participating in the United We Ride National Leadership Forum will be eligible to submit an application for State Coordination Grants, to address gaps and needs related to human service transportation in their geographic regions.
- *Help Along the Way.* This technical assistance program will build on the work of the Community Transportation Assistance Program (CTAP), the Rural Transportation Assistance Program (RTAP), Easter Seals Project ACTION and other stakeholders to provide hands-on assistance to States and communities in the development and delivery of coordinated human service transportation programs.
